The tailgate offers breakfast and lunch/dinner so once you're on Post, you have a "home base." The Club does NOT make a profit holding this event.

Unlike a typical tailgate, tailgates at West Point run from the morning until the evening as cadets can attend the tailgate after the game. YES, West Point Tailgates run AFTER the game, too! Our tailgate tickets include unlimited food and beverages (including adult beverages for those over 21.) Cadets attending with their parents attend for free. Can't attend but would like to help feed a cadet? Donate an individual cadet ticket! Help us feed more cadets! WPPC-GA members have a reduced price on tickets. Other exciting features of our tailgate tent include:
